The Treasure and the Pearl

⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. ⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. ⁴⁶ When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

Matthew 13:44-46 (NIV)

These parables make a point that is <u>spiritual</u>: everything this world deems worthwhile or important counts a sheer loss.

⁷ But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ **Philippians 3:7-8 (NIV)**

- 1. The kingdom is in value
 - This treasure is incorruptible, undefiled, unfading, eternal and reserved in heaven for believers (1 Peter 1:4)
- 2. The kingdom is not superficially (outwardly, at first glance)
 - The natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. (1 Corinthians 2:14)
 - Unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. (John 3:3)
 - There are none who seek after God. (Romans 3:11)
